After an enforced break in 2020 caused by you all know what, the Goodwood Revival Meeting was back this year, and in cracking good form too!

Trying to find accommodation within a 50mile radius of the Goodwood Circuit is almost impossible unless you book from year to year. Bearing this in mind, Kath and I had arranged to stay with our Healey friends, Richard and Barbara Long, who live in Lindfield, West Sussex and about an hour's drive from Goodwood.

The Longs own a 1958 100/6 and the original plan was that we would drive down to Sussex in our 3000 and go to Goodwood in a 2-car 'convoy'. However, plans changed when the local West Sussex Alvis Club decided to make a day of it on Friday, the first day of the event. How does this affect us? Well, also located within 'Scuderia Long', they have a rather nice 1963 Alvis TD21. "A car with four seats and a roof" exclaimed Kathryn, "that'll do nicely". And there's me thinking she liked top-down motoring. We were going to be honorary members of the Alvis club for the day.

There was a 1005 Healey in the parade (RWD 323) but the outstanding car of the parade had to be the Mercedes-Benz 3005LR which Moss and his redoubtable navigator, Denis Jenkinson won the 1955 Mille Miglia at an average speed of 98mph. A feat that has never been beaten.

The Alvis members had taken up residence on the grass bank by Madgwick Corner, ideal for our picnic lunch prepared by Barbara. As Madgwick is the first bend, after the start, and it has a double apex, it can be a very interesting place to watch the racing.
